



How to move your super to KiwiSaver.



Moving permanently to New Zealand? We'll help your super move with you.



Are you now living in New Zealand permanently?

If so, you may be thinking about moving your Australian superannuation to a Kiwi Saver account. While it is not a legal requirement, if you aren't planning on moving back to Australia, this transfer can make good sense.

It is not compulsory for you to transfer your Hostplus superannuation benefit to a KiwiSuper account when you move permanently to New Zealand. Before you make a decision, you should compare the differences between your Kiwi Super fund and Hostplus. When you transfer your Hostplus benefit to a KiwiSuper account any insurance you have with Hostplus will cease. In addition to considering the insurance implications you should you compare the fees. It is recommended that you seek independent financial advice before you make your decision.

The Trans-Tasman retirement savings portability scheme.

If you're an Australian or New Zealand citizen with super benefits in Australia, and you've made a permanent move to New Zealand, the Trans Tasman Retirement Savings Portability Scheme makes it easy to consolidate your super into an authorised Kiwi Saver Fund.

Moving to a KiwiSaver fund.

As your super is leaving the Australian superannuation system and being sent overseas, Hostplus is legally bound to make sure all statutory requirements are met. Those requirements are:

- you have emigrated permanently to New Zealand
- you have requested all of your super to be paid into a Kiwi Saver fund
- you have opened a new Kiwi Saver account
- you have provided us with the Kiwi Saver fund name and your new account number
- the Kiwi Saver fund has confirmed they will accept the payment.

To make the move as simple as possible, the following page provides details of everything you need to give us so we can get everything sorted for you.

It is not possible to move KiwiSaver funds into Hostplus.

At present Hostplus, does not accept transfers from a KiwiSaver scheme.

Australian super funds are not required, by law, to accept balances transferred from New Zealand (whether from a KiwiSaver scheme or from another NZ super fund).

If, or when this policy changes, we'll let our members know.



Australian-sourced super savings transferred to a KiwiSaver scheme:

- can't be withdrawn to buy your first home
- can only be accessed once you turn 60 and satisfy the accepted Australian superannuation industry definition of "retirement" at that age
- can't be transferred to a third country

How to move your super.

1. Complete the transfer form

To get the process started you will need to complete a "Transfer to KiwiSaver" form.

Call the Hostplus Service Centre on 1300 467 875 if you are still living in Australia or +613 9624 7370 if you have already moved to New Zealand, between 8am – 8pm AEST and ask for it to be either mailed or emailed to you.

Once you receive the form, make sure you complete all the fields marked 'Mandatory'.

2. Send us these documents

As well as the "Transfer to KiwiSaver" form, you'll also need to send us:

2.1. Proof of your identity in a certified document

You'll need to provide a certified copy of a current drivers licence or passport. To have a document certified, simply take the original and photocopies of both sides (where applicable) to an authorised official.

In New Zealand, authorised officials include:

- Australian Consular or Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the Consular Fees Act 1955)
- Judge of a court
- Notary Public
- Police officer
- Registrar (or Deputy) of a court

The official must write:

- in English – on the photocopies: 'This is a true and correct copy of the original' and
- their full name, address, occupation, date and registration number (if applicable) and sign each page
- Proof of their position eg. police badge number, consular stamp or similar


2.2. Proof of your residence in New Zealand

If your licence doesn't have your current address on it, please provide another separate document that does. For example, a power bill, rate notice or bank statement.

2.3. A signed Australian or New Zealand Statutory Declaration confirming that you have moved permanently to NZ.

Please complete a statutory declaration confirming that you have now permanently moved to New Zealand.

- clear and legible - and taken from the original documents.
No copies please
- certified on the front of the photocopy not on the blank reverse side

Your checklist.

- Have you consented to the payment of the whole of your Australian superannuation benefits into a KiwiSaver fund?
- Have you confirmed that the KiwiSaver fund provider will accept the transfer?
- Have you opened a KiwiSaver account to accept the transfer – and have you provided the account name and number to Hostplus.
- Have you completed the Hostplus "Transfer to KiwiSaver" form you received from us?
- Have you attached proof of identity, proof of residence in New Zealand, and a properly signed and witnessed Australian or New Zealand Statutory Declaration?
- Have you completed all the forms, provided all required documents and returned them to Hostplus?
