



GET READY FOR PAYDAY SUPER

What you need to know

Important Payday Super laws will take effect from 1 July 2026 and we're here to help you prepare.

Key changes for employers

✓ Super Guarantee (SG) Contributions:

Must be remitted to the super fund (weekly, fortnightly or monthly) with all the necessary information to allocate the contribution to the employee's member account within 7 business days of pay day.

For new employees, or to a new complying super fund for an existing employee, contributions must be received within 20 business days from payday. Small or irregular payments are added to the next payday cycle.

✓ Updated SG charge:

Employers will face an updated SG charge for late or incomplete contributions. The ATO will administer compliance and provide support.

Benefits of Payday Super for employers

✓ Simplified payroll:

More frequent payments streamline payroll management and prevent large liabilities.

✓ Improved error messaging:

Enhanced SuperStream standards allow quick error resolution.

✓ Easier fund nomination:

A new Fund Validation Service (FVS) will provide a validation tool to help employers ensure their super contributions are sent to the right fund, using the correct payment and messaging details.

✓ Onboarding transparency:

By 1 July 2026, super funds will use a Member Validation process, enabling employers to verify that an employee's super fund details are correct and active - helping prevent errors and future refunds.
